Beverly High Artist, 'Bendow,' Displays At Sno:la

Organic frozen yogurt, made from scratch with the best ingredients, combined with a display of original artwork, is the recipe for Sno:la Beverly Hills.

The drawings of Beverly High student/artist, Bendow, created from an array of found, recycled and repurposed materials — including vintage photographs, ATM receipts and box tops — will open today from 6 to 9 p.m. at 244 N. Beverly Dr. and run through Friday, Aug. 28.

Though open since late 2007, this is Sno:la's premiere art exhibit. Said store manager Joshua J. Wayne, an artist and musician himself: "We want to showcase local artists and especially excited about Bendow's

work because it reflects Sno:la's environment-friendly philosophy. Bendow is young and utilizes materials he's found or are already has on hand."

Sno:la's organic dairy fro-yo flavors are developed in a test

kitchen. A seasonal flavor is featured, along with five signature flavors.

Among more than 40 rotating toppings are the best-selling organic gummy bears and locally grown seasonal fruit. Cups and utensils are biodegradable. A portion of profits is donated to Slow Food.

Recognized as a California Arts Scholar, the Beverly High senior (also known as Ben Waldow) has shown his work in gal-

leries since he was 15-years-old, and customizes tennis shoes with his iconic characters. He is interning this summer at Norm Maxwell Gallery in Los Angeles.
